If the assessed value of any real estate parcel has increased by ten percent (10%) or more, a "Notice of Increase of Assessment" will be mailed on or before January 15, 2017. If you receive a notice and have questions or concerns, you should contact our Real Estate Office at one of the numbers listed above.

If, after the Assessor's review, a property owner disagrees or believes his or her value(s) are not correct, the following procedure is available:

In accordance with West Virginia Code § 11-3-24, the County Council shall convene for the purpose of reviewing and equalizing assessments made by the Assessor.

No questions of class changes or late filing of farms shall be addressed; only questions of assessed value will be reviewed.

The Fayette County Council will convene as a Board of Review and Equalization in January 2017 and hold hearings in Fayette County Commission Chambers, 100 Court Street, Fayetteville, West Virginia, as follows:
