2015 ASSESSMENT INFORMATION AVAILABILITY

2015 Real Estate Appraisal/Assessment information will be available for informal public review beginning January 15, 2015. Assessor's Office staff will be available for questions and any informal review a property owner may desire. Our address and telephone number appear above.

If the assessed value of any real estate parcel has increased by ten percent (10%) or more, a "Notice of Increase of Assessment" will be mailed on or before January 15, 2015. If you receive a notice and have questions or concerns, you should contact our Real Estate Office at one of the numbers listed above.

If, after the Assessor's review, a property owner disagrees or believes his or her value(s) are not correct, the following procedure is available:

In accordance with West Virginia Code § 11-3-24, the County Council shall convene for the purpose of reviewing and equalizing assessments made by the Assessor.

**No questions of class changes or late filing of farms shall be addressed; only questions of assessed value will be reviewed.**

The Fayette County Council will convene as a Board of Review and Equalization in January 2015 and hold hearings in Fayette County Commission Chambers, 100 Court Street, Fayetteville, West Virginia, as follows:

Tuesday	February 3, 2015	9:00 A.M. (Mineral/Industrial hearings)
Monday	February 9, 2015	9:00 A.M.
Friday	February 13, 2015	1:00 P.M.

**February 20, 2015 is the LAST date to submit review applications and appeal hearings.**
